Mission



<u>GSBS Mentorship Program</u>: The GSBS mentorship program is an initiative spearheaded by GSA to allow incoming GSBS students to have a smoother transition into graduate school by paring them with current GSBS students. A few changes have been made this year to update the program and facilitate participation. The program format has switched from one-on-one to small groups consisting of 1-2 mentors to 3-5 mentees grouped by research interests. We have 24 small groups participating. Another change was to provide a mandatory lunch on the first Friday of the month to discuss a set topic with set discussion questions. This takes the pressure off the students having to find time to meet individually and has a structure to the conversations. In September, we had over 100 people participate in the first lunch, where we discussed finding a community and settling in Houston. Future monthly topics are drafted below:

- October Picking your next rotations
- November What scientifically motivates you? (Alternative: Picking a program; Setting goals)
- December Prioritizing Rest and Breaks
- January Holiday Break (no meeting)
- Feb Applying for Funding (scholarships, fellowships, and more) **
- March Choosing a Mentor & How to navigate conversations with your PI
- April Work-Life balance
- May End of year wrap up
