

Individual Fellowship Award Program

The GSBS Immunology Program has established an award program to encourage PhD students to apply for nationally competitive individual fellowships. This program will provide students with a \$250 award for those who successfully submit a fellowship application and an additional \$1000 award for those who are successfully funded by the respective extramural agencies or foundations but not selected by GSBS External Fellowship Award (external funding opportunities webpage). Although GSBS students have received fellowships from a variety of programs including the NIH NRSA, NSF GRFP, and the American Heart Association, many graduate students who are eligible and competitive for fellowships do not apply. The goals of this new award program are to engage more students in the fellowship application process and create an environment that encourages more graduate students to apply to external fellowship programs.

Eligibility:

Students can apply for the fellowship award once per academic year.

To qualify for the \$250 fellowship submission award, you must:

- Be a full-time PhD or MD/PhD student in good academic standing.
- Have a primary affiliation with the Immunology Program.
- Have at least one Individual Fellowship consultation with the Fellowship Navigator Office.
- Develop and submit a fellowship application to an external funding agency for an award that provides support for at least half of the student's stipend and tuition and fees.

To qualify for the \$1000 fellowship recipient award, you must:

- Satisfy all requirements of the fellowship application award.
- Receive notice of award from funding agency indicating that your application has been approved for funding.
- Eligibility contingent on not being selected for the GSBS external Fellowship Award ([external funding opportunities webpage](#)).

\$250 Fellowship Application Award

- Letter of support from the student's mentor verifying that they have reviewed the student's application and that they believe it is competitive.
- Documentation that the fellowship award is greater than half of student's current base stipend and tuition and fees.
- An electronic copy of the final fellowship application.
- Verification of receipt of the application from the funding agency.

\$1000 Fellowship Recipient Award

- An electronic copy of the final fellowship application.
- Application review statement.
- Notice of Award from funding agency indicating duration of award and level of support.

Exceptions:

Applications for appointments to an institutional training grant are not eligible for this program. Any internal UTHealth, MD Anderson, or GSBS fellowships/scholarships do not qualify for this program.
